
Enroll Now

Open Enrollment for the 2024-2025 School Year for SFDS Families!

Enrollment for the 2024-2025 academic year is now open for all current SFDS families. Instructions for re-enrollment have been sent via email to all existing families. If you haven't received an email from the school office (Mrs. Knaffla), please check your junk/spam folder or contact the office directly. Re-enrollment is processed through our school's FACTS Student Information System (SIS) Family Portal. You can re-enroll by signing into your FACTS Family Portal using the QR Code or the link provided on the back page of the newsletter. If you encounter issues accessing your FACTS Family Portal or have forgotten your username and password, please contact the office for assistance. Families with a new preschool student to enroll should also contact the office to add the student to

their Family Portal Account.



Strangulation (from toys and clothing)

Allergic Reactions (food, stings)

Fractures (from falls)

Choking Hazards (broken toys, snacks)

Cuts and Bruises (falls, rough play)

Sprains and Strains (from falls)

Abuse (by staff)

The best prevention is awareness and proper supervision. Accidents do happen but follow these steps to prevent most injuries.

1. Be mindful

Know your surroundings, what can happen, where, when, and why? Be "actively" watchful at all times.

2. Identify Risks
Make an effort to reduce effects of things that may cause injury. And always report unsafe environmental concerns or staff actions to
